Director's Statement

As absurd as Bump appears to be, its seemingly trivial conflict - a young man accidentally bumps into another on a random afternoon - is really an attempt to dissect how masculinity manifests itself in the modern age. The film aims to examine the intense fragility and insecurity lingering behind most, if not all, displays of machismo, particularly amongst young men.

The two characters represent mirror images of one another in how they dress, converse and ultimately see themselves. The younger boy is in a sense the counterfeit version, feigning a veneer of masculinity whereas the other character seems to effortlessly exude it. Through this relatable scenario, we see glimpses of the uniquely fragile brand of toxic masculinity that pervades modern youths struggling to validate their existence with little guidance and ample ambiguity.

What initially made this project deeply personal for me was the bitter realization that I too had spent many years pursuing a corrupted version of masculinity. This pursuit was in hindsight fuelled by a severe insecurity and centuries of deeply rooted and deeply toxic notions of what manhood is and should be. I feared other men and even more so feared the man I thought I was becoming - a lesser man. Bump is this story.
